As a lifelong Lutheran, no activity seems to bring on more fear and foreboding than **EVANGELISM!** Whenever this term is used amongst polite Lutherans, everybody thinks "Oh my Gosh, I have to go pound on doors and invite people to our church." Where's the nearest foxhole for me to jump into so I'm not "chosen"!

OK, calm down. First of all, we're all "chosen" because of our Faith in Jesus Christ and that he died for each one of us. #### **ROOF LOAN UPDATE**



The loan to repair the Fellowship Hall roof is being paid down every month by \$270.75. The roof loan, which started at \$25,377, now has a balance of \$12,768 thanks to some generous donations that helped to pay down the balance faster. The 10-year loan will now be paid off in August 2025, and any additional donations towards the loan will help to pay it off even sooner and also reduce the amount of interest paid.
