Here's what's on the Calendar for our Bicentennial Celebration

Here are some of the exciting things we're planning for our 200th anniversary as a church. Exact dates need to be selected by the committees and approved by council. Thank you in advance for everyone who has signed up to help plan.

February: We completed and submitted our revised constitution for final synod approval, giving us the opportunity to reflect on our ministries and mission.

March: We celebrated the Installation of Pastor Robyn with a worship service and luncheon.

April: We will celebrate our 199th Easter as a congregation! Alleluia!

May: We'll Invite past confirmands back to St. John's to hear about their lives, hear stories about their memories, eat together and take some group photos showing their confirmation years. If you're on the event planning committee, now is the time to begin reaching out to confirmands who are still in the area.

June: Love will be in the air when we host a wedding reception and vow renewal, inviting the community and especially anyone who was married in either St. John's sanctuary. Plus Pastor Robyn will give the opening prayer at the Miamisburg City Council meeting.

July: Outdoor picnic party and short service in our outdoor worship space. Let's invite some dignitaries.

August: Display and description of historical items and artifacts.

September: As soon as weather allows repair of the water leak around our steeple, we hope to hold a rededication of both sanctuaries to help us remember our founders and the many lives that have been influenced by our presence in the Miami Valley.

October: Our annual "Trunk or Treat" family event in our historic cemetery.

November: St. John's will host the Miamisburg Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service.





Pastor's Pen- Easter Hope and Love Wins

John 15:12 "This is my commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you."

I enjoy remembering the things of Easter's past. Spring always included a shopping excursion for new white shoes. Don't ask me why, but when we would get home I would position them on my night stand, displayed like they were in the store, one shoe on top, at right angles to the other shoe. That way I could see them if I woke up in the night. There is something fresh and new about the metaphors that surround Easter—eggs, baby chicks, new shoes and the spring colors of possibility. Metaphors are meant to point us towards the deeper meanings of Easter. **The resurrection of Jesus calls us to newness of life and proclaims God's message that goodness will always triumph over evil; justice over injustice; love over hate; truth over deceit; life over death.**

Lent has given us many weeks to notice God's presence in our lives. Did you find God in any surprise locations or circumstances? Have you missed our alleluias? I confess that I uttered a few under my breath at my installation as your pastor. Being with you is a "cup runneth over" kind of feeling. I thank you for a wonderful day!

This month because of the violence at two mosques in New Zealand, the interfaith community was invited to come together to remember, grieve, and to comfort one another. We gathered at the Al-Huda Mosque in Bellbrook. I was asked to be one of a handful of speakers that night. It was a powerful event with hundreds of people present. After my short address, I was approached by the young women in the photo above. They were moved by my words and wanted to say thank you and...of course take a selfie! There was such an outpouring of love that grown men cried.



At the conclusion of the event the Muslims went to the back wall to pray the prayer offered when someone dies. They explained that they do this with their backs to us, as a way of saying they trust that we have their backs. All of it inspired me to remember that Jesus's resurrection is the bold assertion of God's power over the forces that create fear, war, poverty, racism, xenophobia (dislike of or prejudice against people from other countries), homelessness, loneliness, and oppression. The resurrection of Jesus declares that evils in the world will not, and cannot, overtake the love of God.

As we enter into these last days of Lent and stand in awe of God's love, I pray we know that the light that comes into the world shines on, and for, every human being.
