#### What Would Be Our Church's Next Steps?

After attending the first "Addiction Crisis-A Catholic and Lutheran Response" educational event,



here are some possible next steps for us to consider. Our Discipleship Committee will be reviewing these recommendations.

#### **Low Commitment Possibilities:**

#### Partner with local recovery houses to:

- Provide yardwork, minor household repairs (possibly God's Work/Our Hands Sunday, Sept. 8)
- Donate personal care or household items to a recovery house or recovery center
- Sponsor a holiday event at a local recovery center
- Pray for all individuals & families affected by addiction

#### Make available prevention and recovery materials in your church:

- Put out "GetHelpNow" literature
- Distribute faith-based community tips for stopping overdose deaths
- Be a medication drop box location
- Talk to our kids about drugs
- Download the GET HELP NOW-Montgomery County App from the App Store or Google Play

#### **Moderate Commitment**

#### Host educational trainings for our members and the neighborhood such as:

- Project Dawn (naloxone) training (1 hour)
- How to Talk to Kids about Drugs (1-2 hours)
- Mental Health First Aid training (8 hours)
- Trauma & Its Impact (2-4 hours)
- Each September during Addiction Recovery Month invite someone to share their recovery story as part of a worship message

#### **High Commitment**

- Train leaders in "Building Prevention with faith" which teaches how to integrate prevention messages into small groups and worship
- Launch a recovery ministry or continue to host recovery activities such as 12 step fellowship groups (We have several that meet at St. John's currently)



### Pastor's Pen-Community Has Never Been More Important

**Galatians 6:2** Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.

I've shared with you how heartbreaking it is when I'm called to sit with a family who has just lost a child or loved one to a drug overdose. Walking them from a waiting room to the trauma bay to see the body of their loved one is gut wrenching. As a chaplain and as a pastor, it has become an all too frequent reality. That's why I was so happy to see our ELCA Synod partner with the Archdiocese of Cincinnati to discuss concrete ways the faith community can respond to the addiction crisis. Addiction is a tragic disease that hijacks the brain, the person and the family that loves them.

Attending the joint conference event confirmed something I already knew, that community support (the kind that is found in our congregations) can play a pivotal role, not only in recovery but in prevention education. This is especially true if we are willing to become a safe space for people to

talk openly about their lives and the burdens they carry. Community is important for so many reasons. For example, we are coming to understand that people seek and make meaning in their lives in diverse ways. Sometimes those ways are destructive such as hanging in a circle of unhealthy friends. For me and I suspect you, church is how and where **we** make meaning, secure in who and whose we are. When a person or family finds themselves affected by addiction, a supportive faith



community can keep them grounded in healthy ways of developing the self and it can help them know the joy of a lifelong circle of like-minded friends.


Roman's 3:23 reads "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus." To be sure we are each a work in progress and knowing that, we are in a unique position to judge not. One of the ways we support others in community is by "carrying each other's burdens," (Galatians 6:2) by reaching out in love, listening in love, and when needed, giving someone a soft place to fall.

I confess that one of the things I love about each of you is that you too like to make a difference in the lives of others. You care deeply. Whether that is making noodles for the Chicken dinner that support Helping Hands food bank, or serving those who are experiencing food scarcity or homelessness during our Son Rise Breakfasts---you care about showing the love of God to others. I don't know exactly how we might involve ourselves as a congregation in ending the addiction crisis. I do trust that if that is where we feel Jesus is guiding us, we will follow. And I love that.


