## Pastor's Pen-The Fear Factor

"Do not be afraid, for I am with you. Do not be discouraged, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you. I will hold you up with my victorious right hand."

Isaiah 41:10

ear is something we all experience. No one is immune. Being afraid can be healthy and appropriate, especially if danger is involved. However when fear becomes crippling, it's not helpful. It holds us back.

The early disciples found themselves regularly afraid. Immediately after the crucifixion the bible records that they were hiding out for fear of the Jews. The disciples were Jews themselves so really, they were afraid

of the unknown, of not knowing what would become of them now that Jesus was physically absent. It wasn't until they grasped the reality that Jesus would be with them always that they took courage enough to get back to work. Courage doesn't mean you are no longer afraid. It means you are willing to act despite your fear.

The story of the disciples can provide comfort and perspective because we know how the story turns out. If the disciples had remained locked away in fear, the gospel would never have gotten the worldwide traction that caused it to spread. Scripture tells us that they continued to preach, teach, baptize, and heal. We also know that Paul traveled far and wide to share the gospel.


You're just afraid of getting hurt for the same reason.

## <u>A LOVE THAT NEVER ENDS PEACE CAMP -</u> JULY 8-12, 6:00 -8:15 P.M.


