he best part of celebrating our bicentennial has been learning about our story like history. What a blessing to hear each of the temple talks that have shared your memories. Learning from you who were here as young children that the old sanctuary didn't have restrooms but rather out-houses, puts any whining about winter woes to rest! Imagine huddling around a single stove and having to go outside during a snow storm!

And across the street at the site of the old log cabin where worship was once held in even more rustic surroundings, I can almost hear the faint sounds of the faithful singing the old hymns. Did you know that there is an old hickory tree on the front of that property? And another one a ways back. It sits between our old pioneer cemetery and the Reed homestead, likely marking the property line but also providing the edge of the original dirt road where our members drove horse and buggy to church services or to bury their loved ones. I learned that there is even an old stone bridge laying silent in the creek, a bridge that would have carried so many people along its back. This is holy ground.

What were they thinking and hoping back in the day? They could only have imagined the future that is now ours to steward. What must God think as God imagines the next hundred years? That is the sacred invitation that this bicentennial provides. What will we do with the gift we've been given? How will we honor the saints in light that have walked these grounds, shared the faith,

and raised up our parents, grandparents and great grandparents? Can you hear them whispering their wisdom in your ears?

It was equally a blessings to remember those married within our walls over these last 200 years. Remembering them while officiating the renewal of vows for today's generation was, well, really wonderful. Thank you to all who participated and to all who came to witness the love in this place we call St. John's.



- 1 ½-inch binders
- Pencil bags (more of the grades require these than boxes)

**You will receive:** One FREE 8X10 standard print and church directory. \$30 to spend at Shutterfly.com with any Lifetouch photography purchase.





### **Chicken Sesame Salad**

2 chicken breasts 1 head shredded lettuce

2 tsp. ginger 4 green onions ½ cup sesame seeds 1 can rice noodles

½ cup almonds

Dressing:

4 tbsp. sugar 1/2 tsp ground pepper

4 tbsp. white wine vinegar 1 cup oil

1 tsp. salt

Boil: chicken breasts in ginger, cool and dice.

Toast: sesame seeds and almonds.

Layer: shredded lettuce, green onions (chopped), chicken, sesame seeds, almonds and rice noodles.

sesame seeds, annonas and nee noodies.

Dressing: Cook and cool; sugar, white wine vinegar, salt & ground pepper and oil (when ready to serve).

Just before ready to serve, pour dressing, toss and serve immediately. This salad does not keep overnight (it will get soggy).
