A Message from Our New Council President, Brian Kent

or some newer members who do not know me well, I want to introduce myself in a unique and personal way. I am a really strong introvert or "I" personality. Until I read the book "Quiet" recently, I didn't fully appreciate the challenges and gifts of being an "I". One of the characteristics is that an "I" must have

quiet time alone every day to think, decompress, and keep things in perspective. It helps me *listen, and collaborate better, and accept personal setbacks easier.*My "I" time is spent with music, fine detailed hobby projects, and my never-ending attempts to strengthen my personal faith. Whatever "room" I'm physically in as I think and pray about my faith *is* my chapel, hence the column title.

Last week, your elected council chose me as your 2020 Congregational President. Leading this congregation means balancing humility, anxiety, joy, and frustration, likely starting with our first big challenge. "Who are we, and where are we going?" Now, don't get too worried.... we're at the corner of Maue and Gebhart Church so we're not "lost". The love of God through Jesus Christ is our Compass, so we can always "find our way". However, what do we want to collectively do as a



congregation as we live our finite lives in faith among a world whose needs well exceed our time and personal resources? Can we fully define, embrace, and execute a mission that gives us a combination of personal and faith based satisfaction and sheer excitement that will attract others to our Mission's cause?

So, let's start realistically. We do outreach, we help people *right now*. Miamisburg is *already* a better community due to our presence. But like an athlete not fully "in stride", we may not be as *efficient* or *effective* in focusing our mission as we must be. Pastor's Pen-Seeing Ourselves in the Story


I love a good book. I love the *good* book. Right now I'm in the middle of both.

Our Lenten study series, "Entering the Passion of Jesus," is based on a book of the same name by Amy Jill Levine. Amy is professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Vanderbilt University. She's a powerful voice of commitment to a God of love, justice, and peace.

This is not your ordinary Lenten study. We will delve into the last days of Jesus' life, finding new ways to understand and question our own lives through the stories of his trials and choices. The journey will challenge us to examine our consciences which can bring us into closer relationship with others and the world.

I certainly understand the preference to jump straight to the triumph of Easter. We know the horrors of crucifixion and the love that compelled Jesus to be a willing participant in that end. But here's the thing as I see it. This study will be comforting and deeply challenging as we talk about the risks Jesus asks us to take in order to love as he did.

It's tempting however we should not read the biblical text, or understand the Passion narrative, the same way we did when we were children. Lent for grownups is a period of personal atonement which gives us the chance to repair past wrongs that may be holding us back. If we think of atonement as "at-one-ment," we discover a deeper understanding. **At-one-**



ment means being reconciled to each other. Our world needs a profound at-one-ment between humanity and divinity. If I sound a little fired up about the topic, I am. The Easter story is possible for the world in 2020 if/when we slow down to reflect on and be transformed by what happened on that first Easter. As we look to St. John's next two hundred years, we are invited to think deeply about how to follow Jesus into that future. Please come join the discussions on Wednesday nights to add your voice by putting yourself into the picture.

Challenge, Jesus' teachings present a challenge to religious authorities and their interpretations of the law, and show us new wisdom for our lives today.

Week 4, March 25 — The First Dinner: Risking Rejection, a woman anoints Jesus with nard in an extravagant act of devotion, prompting a heated debate about expressions of love and community values.

Week 5, April 1 — The Last Supper: Risking the Loss of Friends, Jesus' radical act sets a new example of love and sacrifice in relationship.




BIBLE STUDY BRUNCH - ALL ARE WELCOME
