November is a month of liturgical transition. It is the last month in the church year which ends on Christ the King Sunday, November 22nd. Thus, November's scriptures focus on the end times and the end of our earthly lives. It can tend to be a gloomy month and also a weather transition from the brilliant colors of fall to the bare branches of winter.

This November promises to be especially filled with uncertainty and anxiety, as the numbers of COVID-19 cases continue to rise as the weather forces us to be indoors. Rather than deciding what kind of dish you will contribute to the Thanksgiving feast, this year families will have to decide if it is even safe to gather for a holiday that holds such meaning in our lives and in our history.

With this backdrop of fear, we need to hear St. Paul's words inviting us to encourage and build up each other with renewed commitment to making sure everyone is getting through these trying times in good emotional health. As everything from worship to offices appear to be stripped to the bare essentials, we can reflect on the abundance of God as a counterbalance to the grief we are feeling over the loss of close human contact that many of us experience.

We start November with All Saints Day when we remember those who have joined the Church Triumphant and celebrate what they have brought to our lives. As we share Holy Communion on that day and every Sunday, we are reminded that the Lord's Supper connects us to all the living, but also those who have gone before us and those faithful yet to come.

We end November with the beginning of Advent on November 29th. The cycle of expectant hope and waiting that starts the church year begins again. What is present throughout is Jesus, the source of all hope, and given the way things are, hope is essential to keep us going.

May you find hope in the coming days and trust in Jesus to be present with you!

President's Chapel Mediations

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Oct 23, 2020

By the time this column is published, Hallow'ed Eve (the day before the Feast of all Saints) should be behind us all. I hope the children in your lives had something akin to a normal Halloween experience, even in these restricted times.

I wanted to take this short opportunity to lay out what the next few months looks like for our Congregation. First, we are carefully watching the Montgomery County COVID numbers and hope we don't need to move into Purple. If we do, it means we're back to Zoom Worship Services as long as the purple persists. So far our congregants have been very diligent and fortunate without any church cases, and we hope in earnest to keep it that way. So being optimistic, we'll be transitioning this month from the season of Pentecost to Advent, as we march towards the end of the Calendar year and Christmas.

Before all that, though, there are things we need to do as a Congregation. First, our Financial Management Committee will be in contact with the various committees to assess next year's budget needs. We'll examine our "must have" expenses (utilities, pastor, staff) and our growth expenses (community outreach, synod outreach) and put together a responsible and challenging budget for 2021. Once council looks at and approves this, the congregation will vote on it in late January 2021. Second, we'll be examining which Council positions open up, and recruit to replace members rotating off. If you may be interested in joining Council (all our meetings are virtual) please let me know. Third, Council will begin the process of setting up a "Call" committee to assess our Congregation's desires regarding our next Pastor and starting the process of looking for a suitable candidate.

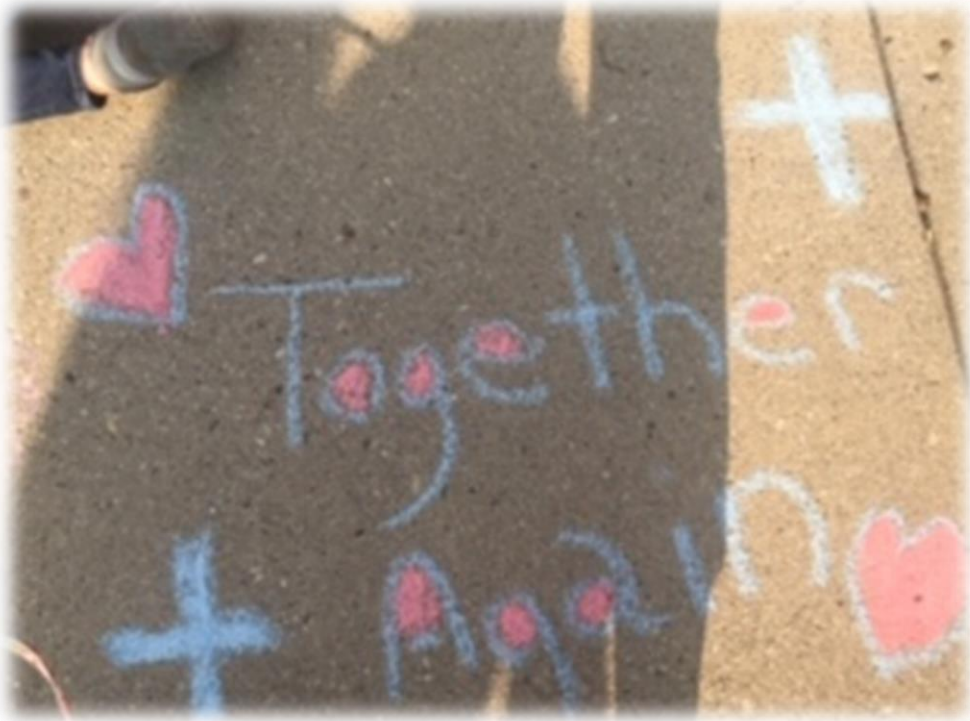
As for our services, we are all very burdened by the lack of singing. As we move into the last 2 months, we are going to try to add soloists (singing from the cry room or upper room) and some instrumentalists. Also, we've researched the current science thinking of "humming" and think this will be ok if we keep our masks on and continue to separate by families. We'll especially try this over Christmas if not earlier.

Lastly – The Christmas forest. After reading your feedback (thanks to all who provided comments) we are going to adopt 1 family as usual **and** add additional ornaments that target helping hands. Some "helping hands" ornaments will have set amounts, others you take will allow you to write in what you want to donate. For those that select these options, just take the ornament and include a check made out to St. Johns and indicate it is for helping hands in the normal. Linda will write them a single check summing all the donations into one check. Note we are going to get the family gifts EARLY this year, so please make sure your gift selections are back at church not later than **Sunday December 13th!**
