This beautiful hymn was written by Charles Wesley some three hundred years ago, yet surely continues to speak to us as we enter into Advent at the end of a most disruptive year.

We might be thoroughly modern people, living a lifestyle that Charles Wesley couldn't even imagine, but we still need liberation. We continue to need Jesus to set us free from our fears and sins, perhaps more than ever. Our lives have been turned upside down by a deadly virus that is currently surging, threatening to overwhelm our healthcare system with ever growing numbers of people sickened by COVID-19. Fear stalks our hearts and threatens to paralyze our outreach on Jesus' behalf.

Let the spirit of hope fill your hearts this very unusual Advent, knowing that Jesus has already shown up and secured our eternal salvation, whether we can be together with our families and church families to celebrate the joy of his coming or not.

President's Chapel Mediations

Dear Siblings in Christ, December 1, 2020

Due to the nature of this month's most important season and to keep you closely appraised on what's going on, Pastor Joan and I are collaborating to jointly compose this December's important newsletter contribution.

We'll start out with some sad news, in that, it looks like the Covid numbers within our county are bad enough, we will not have in person Christmas Eve Service this year. In fact, it could be a couple of months before we even consider the possibility of returning to in person worship as long as our hospitals are >50% capacity and the statewide infections remain above 5000-6,000 *per day.* We both *know* what a hard message this is to read! But, fear not, we are working to put together a Christmas Eve service, *including communion* which we hope will lift your hearts as we celebrate the arrival of our Lord Jesus, our Emmanuel!

So let's talk quickly about the "logistics" of Christmas Eve. We are planning to hold Christmas Eve Service at 8pm, and we are going to ask every family member joining us to be prepared with a candle to light, a small amount of bread to consume, as well as a small serving of wine. We will have a "full communion service" with pastor consecrating our bread and wine during the service. (Hey, even God understands working through a pandemic!) We will also have special music throughout the service, and make this a special night for our church families. And we WILL close with silent night and the lighting of your candle. You can sing your lungs out at home as we play a special version of this timeless hymn.

Also, without the ability to carol or visit shut ins, we need to show them our collective support. I will ask Karen to send out a constant contact with the names and addresses of our shut-ins. Please strongly consider writing each a short Christmas card with a personal note.

After Christmas, we need to lay out what the next few months looks like for our Congregation. Pastor will be off the Sunday after Christmas, so we will prepare a really cool "Christmas Music and Celebration" around the world themed service. We'll record it if you miss it in real time on the website.

So when will we return to in person church? We will carefully monitor the Montgomery County COVID numbers and once we drop out of purple for <u>at least 3 straight weeks</u>, Council will reexamine and vote on returning to our Sanctuary.

Before all that, though, there are things we need to do as a Congregation as we move into the next Calendar year. Planning for 2021 budget will be a bit of a guessing game regarding income and expenses, but our Financial Management team is up to the challenge and we'll do our best to be realistic. Once council looks at and approves this draft budget, the congregation will vote on it in late January 2021 in a virtual Congregational meeting after church service. Part of this meeting will be devoted to replacing Council members rotating off. Third, Council will begin the process of setting up a "Call" committee to assess our Congregation's desires regarding our next Pastor and starting the process of looking for a suitable candidate.

Lastly – The Christmas forest was a rousing success. Looks like most of the items have been picked up, watch your email for final updates. **Just as a reminder, make sure your Christmas Forest gift is wrapped and delivered during Business hours (9-12 am Mon-Thursday) at the church office no later than December 15, 2020.** Our helping hands drive looks very strong; we'll announce our total HH contribution as part of Christmas eve service. We won't be bringing Gold, Frankincense or Myrrh to Miamisburg, but I'm sure those who experience food insecurity will be very grateful for our food contributions.
