# Pastor's Page....

"I call upon you, for you will answer me, O God; incline your ear to me, hear my words. \* Wondrously show your steadfast love, O savior of those who seek refuge from their adversaries at your right hand. 8 Guard me as the apple of the eye; hide me in the shadow of your wings, 9 from the wicked who despoil me, my deadly enemies who surround me." Psalm 17: 6-9

Growing up in the 1960's in a pre-video game world, summer was always a time of outdoor games. My brother, John, and I were allowed to play with our friends after supper until it got dark, and the street lights came on. One of our favorite neighborhood games was Hide and Seek. In the shadows of dusk, we sought to hide ourselves carefully until the one who was "It" would shout: "Olly Olly, Oxen Free!" This call indicated that either "It" had found and tagged a new "It" or "It" had given up in frustration and wanted to start again. The best players were the ones who could stay hidden the longest.

I always wondered what Olly, Olly, Oxen Free meant and where it came from. It turns out it is a corruption of the phrase: "All ye, all ye outs in free." Just from looking at the word "ye" in that phrase, you can tell that the game of Hide and Seek has been around for a long time—maybe since the time in the Garden of Eden. After they had sinned, Adam and Eve tried to hide from God among the trees of the garden as God was walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze. Could that have been dusk?

Sometimes it truly does feel like we are playing Hide and Go Seek with God. We seek God, but finding God seems impossible. At other times, God seeks us, and like Adam and Eve, we hide from God in shame. On occasion, we may feel we have done something so awful, not even God can forgive us.

This passage from Psalm 17 is a reminder that the LORD does not hide from us, but rather serves to hide us from the cares and dangers of the world. This scripture suggests that we are never lost or even hidden from God, and God is never truly hiding. However, the search for God in our lives is as important as the finding.

When the Father sent the Son, Jesus, to live among us and to die for our sake, God came out of hiding to show God's true Self—a God of love, who wants us to have life eternal and the hope that comes with that. Jesus is the permanent "It." The game of Hide and Seek with God is finished forever in Christ. From the cross, Jesus shouts to us all: "Olly, Olly, Oxen Free!" All of us "outs" with God are now free and held in love.

This year we start the season with a new sense of hope provided by the vaccines and falling COVID-19 case numbers. Finally we can stop hiding behind our protective masks. For this we praise God in thanksgiving!

Together we serve the God who loves us enough to give us summer!

#### FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT VBS


