Pastor's Pen....

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13:34-35

Jesus gives this new commandment to his disciples after washing the dusty, calloused feed of his disciples and just after unlovable Judas leaves the dinner and goes out into the darkness of the night on his errand of betrayal. This single command overrides all of the rest. It's the one thing, but it's the hard thing.

After all, if we love one another, we will not kill each other, or steal from others, or bear false witness and gossip against our neighbors. When we have the love that Jesus commands us to have, we naturally will not act in ways that are harmful to others and ourselves. But the only way we can ever actually come close to living in such love for one another is if we are already keeping the first three commandments about loving and honoring God. We need to belong to God with all our hearts and minds in order to love others because often those others do things that hurt us terribly. Often those darn others we are supposed to love just aren't lovable, and they don't seem to love us back either.

One simple commandment: **"Love one another."** Yet our human nature makes this commandment tougher to keep than all the others. Jesus understood that when he said these words to his disciples. He knew they would be facing situations that required love because it is **commanded**, not because it is evoked by the actions of others. Jesus didn't say these words to offer a "suggestion" of how his disciples are to live. He **commanded** them to love and told them that when they love others as he has loved them, it would be so noticeable, so counter the culture of the world in any time or place, that observers would know that they were his followers solely because of it.

Jesus says that this kind of love is a more obvious mark of a Christian than wearing a cross around your neck, or a fish sign on your bumper, or even going to church. Jesus knew these words would be hard for 21^{st} Century people to live by, just as they were hard for the early church fathers and mothers.

The only way we can attempt this kind of love is by remembering the depth of love Jesus shows us. His love is so great, he died for us, and rose from the dead on Easter so that we could share his love for us with others.

We are an Easter people, living in Easter love and celebrating Jesus' Easter resurrection every morning. The power of the resurrection empowers us to love as Jesus did.

President's Chapel

Dear Siblings in Christ,

He is Risen Indeed! Our Easter celebration was magnificent, and it was great after two years to have a real Easter breakfast served indoors without "that thing" hanging over your nose. We should be very grateful in thanking our Savior for sparing the worse for our Congregation. We are especially grateful for the many health and first responders, grocers, and many other service occupations that continues despite the pandemic. We owe everyone our gratitude. Say thanks to your grocer or pharmacist or local business next time you have the chance.

As we move into later spring, there is a LOT going on. Council is currently working on three specific issues.

- 1. Last month, we notified the Congregation that we were in preliminary discussions with Pastor Bonny Kinnunen of Germantown Lutheran about a potential shared pastoral arrangement. Pastor Bonny met with Council, our staff, and our Call Committee. Sadly, after significant conversations, Pastor has terminated the discussions of serving as our shared Pastor. A letter from her to the Congregation may be found elsewhere in this newsletter. On Behalf of the Council and the Call Committee members, we very much appreciated Pastor Bonny's due consideration, and wish her Godspeed in her ministerial duties. Council and the Call Committee will continue to pursue new opportunities to fill our part-time call.
- 2. There are some new ELCA and Southern Ohio Synod guidelines in development regarding the execution of our Church youth programs. Council will be working with the Learning Committee and the Synod to bring us into compliance with the new guidance. Part of the policy requires the publication of this youth policy, so when we're done with our "homework" we'll share that document with the entire congregation. Note this document just doesn't apply to St Johns itself, but any group wishing to use our facility must comply as well.
- 3. Council is looking to start up a small "emergency community outreach group" whose charter would be to work with one-off requests that routinely come to our church for small, short term needs request. I have a separate article about this in this newsletter, so I'll leave details to that article. I will say the effort will be modestly funded, and those on the front lines "helping our community needs" will allow us to put a Christian Face to help legitimate families and individuals in need. Council doesn't expect this effort to be easy nor perfect, but there is enough need out there, we must as Disciples of Christ try our best.
- 4. While most of the church is "physically" in good shape, The Board of Trustees is planning some much needed capital projects for this spring and summer, some of which will require the Congregation's approval because the costs may exceed 3% of our budget. These capital projects include (1) Replacing our 12 year old copier which is on its "digital deathbed" of obsolescence. (2) Putting a stone façade where the ugly white wall is along the new sanctuary entrance behind the plants, (3) cutting up and disposing of deadfall and honeysuckle in the Glen before VBS and (4) replacing the electrical "add-a-phase" motor that powers the elevator to a quiet, solid state, efficient unit that can be left on 24 hours a day. In the coming weeks we'll quantify costs and call a short congregation meeting to proceed. We have some funds for some of these items, but if you have interest in donating to any of the above, just specify it in your donation.

Council looking for Volunteers for a new "Good Samaritan emergency community outreach group"

Per my Presidents Message, Council is looking for 2-4 people to help create a "Good Samaritan" outreach group". Most churches have a small team that can respond to ad-hoc community requests for direct short term financial needs. This may include one-time help with groceries, utilities, rent, or other time critical needs. Council fully understands there are many community organizations with overlapping capabilities and responsibilities to provide *long term help* for those in severe need. However, many of these services are not open nights and weekends, or may not be able to respond to a particular short term time sensitive need. The ELCA is encouraging congregations to stand up what they refer to as a "Good Samaritan" committee. A draft charter of this group is provided below, and the first action would be for the group to finalize it. Council would like to fund this group initially at \$500.00, and will, from time to time, replenish the groups budget in concert with legitimate requests for help. To minimize (not necessarily eliminate) illegitimate need requests, the committee will provide the support commensurate to the need. If it's groceries, perhaps a Kroger Card. For rent, we would pay the landlord directly. In other words, we'll work with the request to make sure whatever aid we prepare goes to the need. Furthermore, we will also provide the requestor with a list of civic organizations and county offices for them to contact for *sustained* help. Now Council realizes such a group may not always get it right and someone being helped may not be fully honest – that's OK. On the balance, if we can help Karen by relieving her of the responsibility to take and act on such calls, that would be greatly helpful. Furthermore, the committee will meet only when it needs to. But they would be on call if Karen gets that "I need food/something else now" phone call.

Please let me know if you would like to serve this ministry. Because of the nature of the group, I really need a mix of men and women to fill this need. Thanks for your consideration. (Brian Kent)
