Hebrews 12:1-2 Who is in the cloud of witnesses that surrounds you? Periodically I ponder that question. In the past, I have always thought of all the faithful Sunday school teachers, pastors, and fellow disciples who have mentored me in my faith over seven decades. But something has happened to help me to see the cloud in a much larger way.

Recently, I re-connected with a fairly distant cousin. Barbara's grandmother and my father were first cousins, and at one time, our families were fairly close. But time and distance had put us out of touch until Facebook sparked a new interest in each other and our families a few years ago. I haven't seen Barbara since I was a little girl.

As I write this, I am planning on getting together with her and some even more distance cousins related to her grandmother's brother the last weekend in July. To prepare for our visit, I went through a box of photos, postcards and documents that had been dumped on me ten years ago by yet another cousin who didn't want to be in charge of the "archive" of my father's side of the family. I was the recipient because of my German language skills.

My family members are relative newcomers to America, as I am only the second generation born here on both sides. Neither my mother's Norwegian family nor my father's German family seemed particularly religious to me as I was growing up. To my knowledge, neither parent was raised attending church regularly. To this day, I'm not even sure my father was baptized. My fraternal grandmother, Minnie, who died when I was 8 or 9, attended a Baptist church, I knew, but my own family only established a connection to a church when I was born through my mother's desire to get my siblings and me baptized. The fact that the church was Lutheran appeared entirely random. I hadn't considered my immediate or extended family to be particularly influential in my cloud as faith was never front and center for them.

Yet unlike others, I had always had a thirst for God, a desire to feel the Holy Spirit moving in me, and I enjoyed hearing about Jesus and his love for all, including the outcasts. Many pastors have parents and grandparents who were pastors, but that was not the case for me. I always wondered, why did I feel called to become an ordained minister? Where in the world did that come from? Who set **me** on the race to perfect my faith?

Back to the box! Sure enough, as I combed through the old photos of unnamed ancestors, a variety of newspaper clippings, advertisements, and assorted official documents, I made some very interesting and unexpected discoveries about my ancestral family. I had been told my grandma's younger sister, Magdalena, or Lenchen as we called her, was a religious sister who taught in an elementary school. Since they all lived in Southern Germany, which is predominantly Roman Catholic, I assumed Lenchen was a nun.

However, I ran across a document labeled: *Ahnentafel Abschrift der Kammerer Magdalena* which is translated: Official Family Tree of Magdalena Kammerer. This paper showed Lenchen's lineage back to the time just before the Revolutionary War and was full of names and information I had never seen before. Each ancestor's name, occupation, birth, death and marriage dates, along with the locations of each event, were written out in spidery German handwriting. The document had an official stamp of the Church Office in St. Georgen, where my grandma and her family lived. Also included for each was their church denomination.

To my surprise, each of these family members were listed as Evangelisch—Protestant or what we call Lutheran! Lenchen's occupation was given as Diakonisse—A Lutheran deaconess and not a Roman Catholic nun.

Suddenly, I found I had a way bigger cloud of witnesses around me than I imagined. Perhaps our family affliation with the Lutheran church was not as much by chance as I have been led to believe. I am just one in a line of Lutherans going back as least as far as only two hundred years after the Reformation.

Now I have begun to wonder, whose clouds include me as one of the witnesses who has encouraged someone to run their race? How have I helped a disciple to "...look to Jesus as the pioneer and perfector of our faith?"

Soon we will be starting our return to the fall routine that includes Faith Formation for our youth through Sunday school and confirmation. We give thanks for those who are encouraging our youth to run the race set before them. Consider how you might also take on a role in deepening someone's faith, becoming a part of that person's cloud of witnesses to the abundant life we find when we live in Christ Jesus!

I hope all our families are enjoying their summer vacations and school breaks. Amazingly, we're just a few weeks from returning to schools, and our own Sunday School will reconvene with "rally day" in September. However, there are a few important items we are trying to complete before this autumn arrives upon us.

I explained in my Pastor's meditations last May that there are some new ELCA and Southern Ohio Synod guidelines in development regarding the execution of our Church youth programs. Council worked with the Learning Committee, and our Synod to write up a new policy to bring us into compliance with the new ELCA wide guidance. Council will vote on the final policy on August 9th, and on Sunday August 21st, we will have a short (15 minute) Congregational Meeting to adopt the new policy. The Congregation's "buy in" is critical to show our support to any staff member working with youth. Our Learning Committee has been part and parcel to this policy, so it shouldn't be a surprise to anyone. But the formality of your approval is critical, so thank you in advance to attending and voting to adopt this policy.

Also, we started on July 31st and will continue until August 7th to get every St John's member to complete a "Congregational Vibrancy" survey. This survey is short, maybe 15 minutes tops to complete. The survey results will be conveyed to Katie Kerrigan at Synod, and she will return on a future Sunday to discuss its results and implications. Thank you in advance for your opinion. Also, if you cannot make it to church on either Sunday July 31st, or August 7th, you can email Karen Doyle, <u>secretary@stjohnsmiamisburg.org</u> for a copy, but your inputs must be received back to Karen not later than August 15th for it to be included.
