"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? Isaiah 43:19 God is always in the business of doing new things. Every morning is a new creation for the world, and we are created new and rinsed clean by the waters of baptism.

Many churches are discovering that the years of the pandemic have created new challenges. It's been difficult to get people to volunteer to work on bringing back the fellowship and outreach life of the congregation after such a long time without these activities of discipleship. Ways of worshipping changed suddenly as it was no longer safe to meet in large groups, and we had to both learn how to do worship virtually and adapt to this new way of gathering together in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Some people simply did not like this new experience and turned away from the church completely during that time. Some have returned; some have not. Others found this new way of worshipping to be very meaningful and appreciated the flexibility of worshipping at any time or place if unavailable at 10am on Sunday morning. Some of those folks will remain faithful distance partners in worship, and others want to become involved in person now that the dire threat of illness has declined.

Earlier this summer, you were asked to participate in a Congregational Vitality Survey, and now on Sunday, October 23rd, we will all have a chance to find out what the survey suggests about our ministry at the corner of Gebhart Church Road and Maue. Pastor Katie Kerrigan, the Southern Ohio Synod's Director of Evangelical Mission, will be joining us for worship and discussing the survey at a fellowship gathering with a light lunch after the service.

After months and months of hitting the "snooze" button, it is time for the good people of St. John's Lutheran Church to reawaken to God's call to ministry in our community. God has a mission in the world and it belongs to God, not us! God is out there on the loose and up to something much bigger than just our congregation. God is on a mission to bless the whole world, and we are invited to take part in that mission. Pursuing God's mission is what we are called to do as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Talking about the vitality of our congregation is a great first step to re-engaging in more active ministry. Pastor Kerrigan will help us to have that discussion. In order to prepare yourself to take part in our conversation, here are a few things that might be helpful for you to think about.

There are three characteristics of healthy and growing ELCA congregations: Purpose, Willingness to Change and Shared Leadership. What we need to reflect on is that it isn't good enough to survive; it's God's desire that we thrive as individuals and as a congregation. We know we can survive and sustain things at our current levels, but how are we invited to take a greater role in God's mission in the world?

A good question to ask is if we have a sense of purpose. Do we have a collective sense of what God wants us to do? Are we pointing out into the world instead into our building? While God is always doing new things, are we willing to change? Are we so committed to God's purpose that we will find new ways of doing things in order to get the job done?

Shared leadership is one thing that has been forced on St. John's by the absence of a designated pastor. While that is certainly something that increases the challenge, it has also shown you that you are able to take care of the business of the church and each other by stepping into your role in the Priesthood of All Believers. Every single one of you are a minister for Christ, because all of life is ministry and service to God.

Our congregation will be challenged by what we hear from Pastor Kerrigan, but we can make sure that the challenge is the inspiration we need to recover our sense of purpose and mission in our community.

Please plan on joining us on Sunday, October 23rd after worship. The stakes are high for our future and our ability to be a part of God's mission. See you there!

Did this poster get your attention? Great, I certainly hope so, because October is a crazy busy month for St John's and council needs some serious member help for some upcoming events. So, what's on the calendar?

The month opens with the second week of a big TWIGS event in the fellowship hall Friday, September 30th – Saturday, October 1st. Of course, being a Saturday, the Tamil School will be in session 10:30 am-12:30 pm that same day. On the 1st, we will again have our 2022 Community "Shred and Bread" event from 10:00 am-2:00 pm. We will serve coffee, donuts, brats and drinks (free will donation) during this time. I'll need perhaps 3-4 people to help direct traffic, take donations, hand out food (Tom Hoffman's cooking), and just have a great time, all while raising funds and collecting food for Helping Hands of Miamisburg. On Sunday, October 23rd, we will have a special congregational event and a catered luncheon. The purpose will be to listen to and receive the results of our Congregational Vitality Survey from Pastor Katie Kerrigan from the Southern Ohio Synod. She will attend our service, and she will stay for lunch. We will be supplying light sandwiches and drinks, and members are welcome to (but not required to) bring a small desert or cookies. Again, I need about 6 people to volunteer to arrange for the lunch, help set up and clean up the fellowship hall for lunch, and take charge of this event.

On Friday, October 28th, we will have our community trunk or treat from 6:00-8:00 pm. Last year's event attracted over 350+ people, and we were overwhelmed with traffic and ran out of candy. This year we want to plan traffic control better. In addition to asking for help from the city police, I would like 3-4 volunteers *in addition to those setting up the trunk or treat,* to help with managing traffic and helping kids cross the street in the dark. This is a GREAT event, we want it to be fun AND safe. Let Brook Nauta know if you want to help out!

Then on Saturday, October 29th, WELCA will hold their annual "Grandma's attic" sale. Let Ida Geary and or Cheryl Page know you can help at any time setting up fellowship hall during the week, or on Saturday to assist with the sale or Monday to help put everything away.

So, if you haven't noticed, the pandemic is now endemic, life moves on. We're depending on "all hands" to help out in renewing St John's church life, so your help would be most welcomed. Gods Blessings!

Jacks' Carrot Cake

2 cups sugar 2 tsp. soda 1 ½ cup oil ½ tsp. salt

4 eggs 3 cups carrots (grated)


Frosting:

8 oz. cream cheese 2 tsp. vanilla 1 stick butter 1 cup walnuts

16 oz. powdered sugar

Cream sugar, oil and eggs. Add flour, cinnamon, soda, salt and grated carrots. Pour into greased and floured cake pan. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes.

Frosting: Cream butter, cream cheese, powdered sugar and vanilla together. Add walnuts. Spread on cooled cake.
