Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He prostrated himself at Jesus's feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? So where are the other nine? Did none of them return to give glory to God except this foreigner?" Then he said to him, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well." Luke 17:15-19

One of the Bible readings assigned for Thanksgiving Day is the story of the healing of the 10 Lepers, (Luke 17:11-19) from which the above quote is taken. I recently read that Martin Luther was once asked to describe the nature of true worship. Luther's answer was, "The tenth Leper, turning back." I have been chewing on Luther's response and what it might mean for us as people of faith. Could it be that the actions of the tenth Leper provide a model for how we are called to live our lives as Disciples of Jesus?

Let's take a closer look at the actions of the tenth Leper in this story.

First, he *saw*. He *noticed* that he had been healed. As people of faith, do we pause and see what God is up to in and around us? Do we notice God's healing presence in our lives? Do we pay attention to how God is actively at work in our church?

Second, when the Leper noticed that he had been healed, he *turned back*, he returned to Jesus. Every week we have an opportunity to turn back and return to Jesus as we gather for worship on Sundays. This continual returning is a natural response, when notice and see the many ways God's healing presence is at work within us.

Next, the Leper shouted his praise, he fell down and worshipped and he gave thanks to Jesus. This is what we do when we gather on Sundays. We speak and sing our praises. We give thanks for God's love and grace. During our time of worship we receive God's healing gifts of bread and wine which nourish us for our journey of faith. Our weekly gatherings ground us in the goodness of God and reminds us where our source of life is found.

Finally the tenth Leper *gets up to go.* He will go back to his family and friends. Back to the life he had before his illness drove him to isolation and quarantine. However, he did not go back the same man. He was transformed by his encounter with Jesus. He received a healing that was more than skin deep. He became a part of God's salvation story.

We too *get up and go* from our weekly worship and we too are transformed. God's gifts at the table give us a fresh start. Fed and forgiven we begin each week freed from the sin that binds us. We *get up and go* so that we can share God's love in our families, our community and the world!

I am eager to begin this new journey with you. As we grow as Disciples of Jesus let's learn from the Tenth (former) Leper as we notice and see what God is up to in our lives. As we turn back each week to praise and worship and give thanks. And as we get up and go to live as Disciples in our day to day lives, sharing God's love with those we meet.

Saturday, Nov. 12th at 9:00 a.m. All help that day is appreciated.












TRUNK OR TREAT
