## PRESIDENT'S CHAPEL

Dear Siblings in Christ,

July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023

Today, I'm starting my column with a good news story. Remember, the work "Evangelical" comes from the Greek word euangelion, meaning "the good news" or the "gospel." When our *actions* support our *words*, we are living the Gospel. Frequently, our national press takes a dim view of Christianity and the impact of Christians living their lives by the Gospel. So it is really noteworthy when someone outside our church takes notice of what we do. On June 12<sup>th</sup>, St John's received a letter from the Miamisburg School Board of Education, noting that our church was successfully nominated for a State of Ohio School Board Association 2023 "Business Honor Roll Award". We were among 21 local businesses and churches honored for supporting various Miamisburg school social issues and needs, and I'll accept the award on behalf of the church on Thursday the 29<sup>th</sup> of June. So thanks for your support of Miamisburg schools through the backpack supply program, the Christmas Forest, and (indirectly) by supporting our Hunger mission through helping hands.

So, how can we magnify our community impacts going forward? First, let's continue to exploit opportunities to fulfill emerging community needs. For example, our summer Friday lunch program, run by Beth Knight, is one opportunity. If you want to help feed some hungry elementary grade kids during the summer, it's not a hard job. Beth can let you know what to do, and with a couple hours investment, you'll make the day for about 40 local kids. Second, now that our remarkable meeting house renovation is nearly complete, we can look to our local schools and community to see if this space can be better utilized than it has been over the last 20+ years. I'll be in touch with the synod about any nascent mission Christian congregations looking for a permanent meeting place. We'll also be reaching out to wedding photographers, planners, and caterers looking for wedding venues, as older but attractive church buildings represent a potentially growing market for wedding locales. Lastly, we are looking to sponsor a few community seminars in the coming year. Some of the proposed seminar topics could include financial planning, estate planning, local historical or science events, and so forth.

If you haven't noticed, time continues to move forward, and the rate of change in our society is accelerating. While St. John's history is rich and long, our congregation must "think differently" as we imagine our church in the future. Our long term impact depends on strengthening our community involvement. While some of these changes may be scary, our evolving mission can also be exciting and fulfilling. If you have ideas about unmet community needs, be sure to let a council member know. In the meantime, enjoy your summer, and keep the faith.

## **Double Layer Chocolate Pie**

1 (4 oz.) cream cheese, softened

1 Tbsp. milk or half & half

1 Tbsp. sugar

1 (12 oz) Cool whip

2 pkgs. (3.9 oz) instant chocolate pudding

1 ½ cup milk or half & half

1 chocolate pie crust

Beat cream cheese, then add milk and sugar. After mixed well, add 1 ½ cups of Cool Whip. Spread in bottom of chocolate crust. Mix pudding with 1 ½ cups milk (it will be very thick). Fold in 2 cups of Cool Whip mixing well. Spread over cream cheese mixture. Refrigerate at least 4 hours before serving.
