PRESIDENT'S CHAPEL

Dear Siblings in Christ,

August 1st, 2023

I am providing some thoughts today on spiritual daily prayer. Here we are in August, it's hot and humid, and it is very easy to feel tired and worn-out in the heat. Perhaps you've had the opportunity to "take a vacation" to different, perhaps cooler climates. Or maybe you're thinking "I really need a vacation" but either don't have adequate time and/or resources to have the getaway you most richly deserve. Maybe you're caring for someone who can't be left on their own, or your work/home life is just too hectic. With school beginning right around the corner, you know time is limited. Even if you've had vacation, getting back to the daily "real world" routine can be difficult. Though talking through such feelings with family and close friends can help, are we overlooking the opportunity to reach out a real expert ...our "mighty counselor"?

It is pretty natural to feel like we don't need daily prayer, especially if things are going well and you have few chronic problems or issues that demand extra time and attention. But I think if you look on one's life as a whole, these "good times" are probably shorter than you think or remember. When we get down, or sick, or face stressful home or job related problems, that same clock that raced past you in good times begins to count the seconds at an exorbitantly slow pace. It's like hospital time --- tick---tick---. Its times like this that we may initiate prayer, where we ask God's forbearance in mitigating our problems. Prayer should be more of an ongoing dialog of hope, for no matter what our journey, we know what awaits our faith. Our "mighty counselor" is always there for us now and will be with us through and after our earthy journey. Since we will be with him in the end for a long time, perhaps we should get to know him better now. Ask him, talk to him in prayer. Not once a year, or once in a while. Greet him in the morning. Say good night in the evening. Why not engage him daily as the lifelong friend he is! I know I certainly need to do better, so no time like the present to improve. Besides, God never needs nor goes on vacation. Voicemails are never necessary.




We will be sending school kits to Lutheran World Relief.

Place the items for the kits in the wagon that is located in the narthex.

Each kit should include the following:

- **Four** 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose leaf paper.
- **One** 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.
- One pencil sharpener.
- **One** pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well).
- **Five** unsharpened #2 pencils with erases; secure together with a rubber band.
- **Five** black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band.
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- **One** 2 ½" eraser.
- **One** sturdy drawstrings backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks).

ICE POPS

1 (3 oz.) pkg. Jello (any flavor)

1 cup sugar

1 sm. pkg. Kool Aid (any flavor)

2 cups hot water

2 cups cold water

Dissolve the gelatin, sugar and Kool Aid in hot water. Add cold water. Mix well and freeze in molds or paper cups. Insert handles. Makes 18.
