# Am I Ok?

This is a profound question that I watch people wrestle with all of the time. I work with teenagers, a role that I find refreshing because, unlike adults, they haven't learned to hide this struggle successfully.

# Am I Ok?

We are, each of us, aware of those things that we don't excel at. Here's a part of my list: I can't sing – despite voice lessons and a strong desire. I'm not remotely handy at fixing things. I'm divorced.... What list plays in your head of things you know you're poor at?

From there, it's not a long walk to start to question other things. If I can't sing- pastors sing I must be a bad pastor. I'm not handy, perhaps I'm irresponsible and a bad neighbor. I'm divorced... so I must not know how to love and succeed as husband, father, son or friend. How does your list expand from your own shortcomings?

# Am I Ok?

So, clearly there's some wrong thinking that can catch us up, taking the genuine things that aren't great and growing them into huge problems, creating an existential crisis. Over the last thirty years or so, our society has learned to try to counter this process. Kids through the school process are filled with positive messages, big dreams etc. Yet, I fear we teach people to ignore or deny the first paragraph, rather than challenge the move from the first paragraph to the second. There are things we aren't great at – all of us. Yet, we don't have to extrapolate those ideas until they become our whole identity. Even well-meaning advice of "focus on the good" only gets us so far. Is it okay to have bad parts? Are they too bad? Are our good parts great enough? What is the line?

# Am I Ok?

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— not the result of works, so that no one may boast." – Ephesians 2:8-9

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"Being saved" is an abstract concept. It's about so much more than "heaven someday". It's about freedom. It's about being "OK". It's about knowing God loves you as you are, with no measuring stick to meet. Being saved is the freedom to be fully you "good" and "bad" because God has deemed you worthy... as a gift!

Yes! In Christ we are freed from society's measuring stick. We are freed from our own. We are created, loved, claimed, and justified. We are deemed... OK – at the deepest level possible.

The less flexible we become, the less able we are to adjust if we step on an uneven surface or are bumped into by someone. The lack of flexibility makes us more likely to fall. While the loss of flexibility is a natural part of the aging process, we can combat it through stretching our bodies to maintain and even increase our flexibility. As a church, we need to continue to work on our flexibility within the context of our traditions. We should consider our faith traditions along with the needs of our greater community and see how we might need to be agile in response to the needs we see. Flexibility and agility require preparation and practice, and sometimes make us uncomfortable. Sometimes, we may stretch ourselves by trying something new and it may not work out. Zscheile calls this making "good mistakes." As we stretch our church body, we can weather some good mistakes, as long as we're agile enough to bounce back. I look forward to stretching toward the future together with you all.


