I've long enjoyed looking at the meaning of words, and where those meanings came from. Here's a little etymological note on rooms in church buildings.

Sanctuary:

The sanctuary is the worship space we use in our church building. It's from the Latin, "Sanctus" meaning "holy". Holy means "set apart for God". Thus, we worship in a space "set apart" for God. Now, that "set apart" is in its usage, not in its physicality. That is, it becomes holy in and as we use it for worshiping God. If it's used for something else, it's not set apart for that so, not holy. That's okay! We don't have a sense that "holy" is a permanent thing, only that things are holy in there usage. So – can we host a group in our sanctuary that isn't worshiping God? Yes. And, when we worship God again, it's holy again! Voila!

East Wall:

The side of our sanctuary that houses the altar is called the "east wall". In our case, this is literally the wall on the east side. Yet, in all churches the wall behind the altar is called the "east wall". This is an ancient metaphor that started when people started building church buildings (sixth century – before that, people worshiped in homes!). In the east, we see the light coming into the world, renewing things, in the sunrise. As we worship, we look to God to come into the world, renewing things – "Sonrise." Now, it's only a quirk of English that "sun" and "Son" sound so similar, yet the metaphor for church spaces transcends language. God is light, coming into our world with hope and renewal through Christ. Accordingly, many churches are built so that their "east wall" is on the east!

Narthex:

Outside the sanctuary is the "narthex". A narthex referred to a narrow porch or entry way to a building, like we use to enter the sanctuary. But the original etymology is more fun. Porches/entry ways were called "narthexes" in the first place because they resembled a giant fennel stalk. Narthex is literally "giant fennel". Fennel stalks are tube like, and could be used like a funnel. In Greek mythology, Prometheus flew up to the sun and brought back fire for humans. He carried the spark in – you guessed it – a giant fennel! So, light, warmth and meaning came to humanity through the fennel. As Christians we know this to be what Christ provides for us through the cross. The vessel or means by which the "gift of the gods (God) comes into the world. We are receiving God's blessings!

Today, we use these words (sanctuary, Narthex, East Wall), without fully appreciating their story. For me, at least, knowing where they came from adds meaning to our use of them. We are "fenneled" (funneled) into God's renewing activity as we enter into a space (time) set aside for God (holy) and thus this is how are church is named.

I hope you found this etymology jaunt fun and illuminating!

The Women's Council just celebrated their 90 year of Christ-Like Love and Willing Hands.

The early beginnings of the Women's Council started as Graceworks Lutheran Services, known as the Inner Mission League of the Miami Valley in 1926. It was first formed in response to the flooding in the Ohio River Valley, and many people were displaced and found themselves without the basic necessities of life. Nine years later, they were still finding their footing, attempting to meet the needs as best they could reeling from the Great Depression and soon heading to war. A building was leased at 19 n. Perry Street to house their operations. Just one problem, their basement flooded with all their donations of clothing and household items. Enter the Women's Council. We have been meeting on the 3rd Tuesday for 90 years.

Now we support the Common Good in Eaton, Ohio. We also sew and knit items for many resident housing from Bethany Lutheran.
